CHECKLIST: How to Start a Business in Southern Nevada

The following is a checklist for starting a business in Las Vegas, Henderson, North Las Vegas, Boulder City, and Clark County Nevada.

Step 1: Are you ready?

Visit the Nevada Small Business Development Center (Nevada SBDC) at <u>www.nsbdc.org</u> and download the Business Readiness Self- Assessment. Another resource as a mentor/training is the Nevada Business Opportunity Fund (NBOF) and the Nevada Women's Business Center which deliver a comprehensive array of business services and programs specifically targeted to help micro, small, women and minority owned businesses in low-income and disadvantaged communities: <u>www.vedc.org/nevada</u>.

You can also visit the State of Nevada, Department of Business & Industry, Business Resource Center at <u>www.business.nv.gov</u>. There you will find The Learning Center, Resource Directory, a calendar of small business training/events and more.

Step 2: Get a mentor – Develop a Business Plan

Visit SCORE at <u>www.scorelv.org</u> or the Nevada Small Business Development Center at <u>www.nsbdc.org</u> to request a personal mentor who will partner with you at every step, help you write a business plan and be a sounding board for you thoughts.

Step 3: Choose your name and if applicable a Fictitious name

Check the list of business names with the Nevada Secretary of State: <u>https://www.nvsilverflume.gov/businessSearch</u>

A fictitious firm name, or a DBA, is required if the name of your business differs from the name registered with the Secretary of State: <u>http://www.clarkcountynv.gov/depts/clerk/services/pages/fictitiousfirmnames.aspx</u>

Step 4: Decide on a business address

Zoning: You will need to verify the zoning requirements in the jurisdiction in which the business is located prior to choosing a business location. http://gisgate.co.clark.nv.us/gismo/apps/jurisdiction/app/index.html

Step 5: Apply for your EIN number

The Employer Identification Number, issued by the IRS, is like your business' social security number. <u>http://www.irs.gov/Businesses/Small-Businesses-&-Self-Employed/Apply-for-an-Employer-Identification-Number-</u> <u>(EIN)-Online</u>

Step 6: Form your entity and get your state business license

Once you've made the decision, file the proper forms at the Nevada Secretary of State's office: <u>http://nvsos.gov/index.aspx?page=4</u>

Step 7: Register with the Nevada Department of Taxation

The license you need depends on whether you're a retailer, a service provider, or if you purchase items you consume from companies that don't charge you sales tax. Use the Taxpayer Information Packet to get started: http://tax.nv.gov/Publications/Publications/

Step 8: Apply for your local business licenses

Please refer to Step #4 and be sure you're applying for a license in the correct jurisdiction; enter your business address into the Jurisdiction Locater: <u>http://gisgate.co.clark.nv.us/gismo/apps/jurisdiction/app/index.html</u>

Step 9: Hiring Employees
